Lesson - 7

Human Environment -
Settlement, Transport and
Communication.

Notes:-

Settlements :- Settlements are places where people build their homes. Early beings lived on trees and in caves.

Settlements can be permanent or temporary :-

Permanent settlements :- The people living in deep forests, hot and cold deserts and mountains often dwell in such temporary settlements. They practiced hunting, gathering, shifting cultivation and transhumance. However more and more settlements today are permanent settlements.

Temporary settlements :- Settlements which are occupied for a short time are called temporary settlements.

The four major means of transport are roadways, railways, waterways and airways.

Roadways :- The most commonly used means of transport especially for short distances are roads. They can be metalled (pucca) and unmetalled (kutcha). Roads

build underground are called subways/under
passes. Flyovers are built over raised
structures.

Railways :- The railways carry heavy goods and
people over long distances quickly
and cheaply. Indian railways network is
well developed. It is the largest in Asia.

Waterways :- Waterways are the cheapest
for carrying heavy and bulky
goods over long distances. They are
mainly of two types - inland waterways
and sea routes.

Inland waterways :- Navigable rivers and lakes
are used as inland
waterways. Some of the important inland
waterways are the Ganga-Brahmaputra
river system, the Great Lakes in North
America and the river Nile in Africa.

Sea routes :- Sea routes and oceanic routes
are mostly used for transporting
merchandise and goods from one country
to another. These routes are connected with
the ports. Some of the important ports of
the world are Singapore and Mumbai
in Asia, New York, Los Angeles in North
America, Rio de Janeiro in South America,
Durban and Cape Town in Africa, Sydney
in Australia, London and Rotterdam
in Europe.

Airways :- This is the fastest way of transport developed in the early twentieth century. It is also the most expensive due to high cost of fuels.

Communication :- Communication is the process of conveying messages to others. With the development of technology humans have devised new and fast modes of communication.
