

Chapter-5

Adjectives

⇒ Adjective means additional. An adjective is a word that adds to the meaning of a noun/pronoun. Adjectives are of various types -

- Adjective of Quality - They denote the quality of the noun or pronoun. eg - Abdul is a tall boy.
- Adjective of Quantity - They describe the quantity or degree. eg - There is little water in the lake.
- Adjective of Number - They denote the number (cardinal/ordinal) of the noun.
- Demonstrative Adjective - They demonstrate or point to a noun/pronoun. eg - This story is for children.
- Possessive Adjective - They denote possession of its noun. eg - This is my table.
- Interrogative Adjective - They are used to ask questions. eg - Whose shirt is this?
- Proper Adjective - This is formed from a proper noun. eg - Chinese food. Indian clothes.
- Distributive Adjective - Denotes its nouns and pronouns individually. eg - The boys had a bat each.

NOTE - Possessive adjectives are formed from pronouns. They are also called Pronominal adjectives.
